TITLE: Lead Registered Behavior Technician

SUMMARY

The Lead RBT position is a leadership position. In addition to Lead RBTs implementing ABA programs in a 1:1 teaching format to children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder and other developmental disorders, RBTs may assist with the onboarding/training of new behavior technicians, provide support to behavior technicians on the floor in challenging situations, lead groups, and assist with assessments. RBTs will be assigned paid indirect float time up to 30% of hours worked, after all direct shifts are covered.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND REQUIREMENTS

Responsibilities and requirements of a Lead RBT are the same as the RBT and behavior technician. Lead RBTs will be held to a higher standard and will be monitored each week using the RBT integrity check. RBT will also be assigned indirect float time up to 30% of hours worked, after all direct shifts are covered.

REQUIREMENTS

Be a Registered Behavior Technician and have 1000 hours of direct experience.

Average at least 80% or higher on RBT integrity checks for one month.

Pass the Lead RBT quiz.

Demonstrate a high level of integrity, exceptional communication skills, ability to provide feedback to others, ability to work with a variety of clients.

Adhere to company policies and procedures and abide by the [RBT ethics code](#) as indicated by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board.
